The 2016 Ireito Memorial Service was held on August 23, Sunday, at 2 pm at the Alae Cemetery. Blessed with beautiful Hawaiian weather, the 100 strong in attendance expressed their gratitude and

paid respect to our Japanese ancestors, the Issei immigrants, who established their legacy through hard work and sacrifice.
The event was officiated by Rev. Shinji Kawagoe of the Papaikou Hongwanji.
Representatives of the late Sanji Abe family, Consul General of Hawaii, County of Hawaii, Japanese Community Association of Hawaii, Japanese Chamber of

Commerce and Industry of Hawaii, Ireito Trustees, Subaru Telescope, Big Island Buddhist Federation, United Junior YBA, Hawaii Japanese Center, various Buddhist churches, Shinto shrines, and Kenjinkai's offered incense and bouquets of flowers at the Ireito Monument.
