## Long and strong link between Hawaii and Shibukawa

Mr. Takahiro Omori, the President of Shubukawa Ikaho Hot Spring Tourism Association, Mr. Nobuaki Ito, the Chief Secretary of the Association, and Mr. Hiroyuki Nakazawa, the Council member of Shibukawa City visited Hilo to attend Merrie Monarch Festival and to present prize to the winner of the festival. At this time, they brought a copy of a certificate of an award which High Honor gave to Mr. Robert W. Irwin, Consul General of the Kingdom of Hawaii in 1882. The Fourth Class of the Order of the Rising Sun, Gold Rays with Rosette was made to Irwin in consideration for his work to forge ties between Japan and the Kingdom of Hawaii. Mr. Irwin owned a summer house in Ikaho which is preserved to date and that resulted in sister city relationship between the County of Hawaii and Ikaho Town, which is now a part of Shibukawa City in 1997.

Shubukawa Ikaho Hot Spring Tourism Association hosts Ikaho Hawaiian Festival in Augusts. Every four years, hula competition is held during the festival and the winners are invited to Merrie Monarch Festival and perform at the Hoike.
